He joined Communist Party of Pakistan and spent many years in prison for organizing industrial workers, the peasantry, miners and political activists.

In the 1980s, he also served as the joint secretary general of the Movement for Restoration of Democracy (MRD) during Zia's dictatorship.

He also remained allied with political rights movements in Balochistan and adviser to late Mir Ghaus Bux Bizenjo, then governor of the province.

He also edited "In Search of Solutions: An Autobiography of Mir Ghaus Bakhsh Bizenjo".
